Many thanks for your report of reception.

A check with our log indicates that your report of reception of WTAC is correct. This is your verification of reception of WTAC Flint, Michigan. As your report indicates you heard WTAC between 3:35 and 3:55 AM/EST on the morning of November 8, 1950. WTAC was broadcasting election returns from the Flint City Hall. These returns were interspersed with interludes of recorded music and other election bulletins.

WTAC operates on 600-Kilocycles. Our signal is always being beamed northward. During the daytime we operate with an output of 1,000-watts. After local sunset, we drop our output down to 500-watts.

We regret that we do not have any regular verifications (in the form of cards) to send out. Lack of a sufficient number of reports has precluded the printing expense. We sincerely trust that this letter will suffice in it's stead.
