This is to verify reception of WOBR Radio, Wanchese, North Carolina on the following date and time:

November 11, 1970, at 4:42 P.M. EST

WOER is a new station (May 29, 1970) operating on Clear Channel 1530, with 250 watts of power, daytime only, from studios and transmitter one and one-half miles north of Wanchese, N. C., on Roanoke Island, between the Cuter Banks and the mainland of the state. We are about 90 miles south of Virginia Beach, Va., and only three miles for the world famous Nags Head and Hatteras Island resort area of the Atlantic Ocean.

We have received reports of clear DAYTIME reception all along the coast from Quogue, Long Island, New York, to as far south as Myrtle Beach, South Carolina. Ships at sea have reported reception of a clear signal as far as 500 miles away. Because of the position of our station on Roanoke Island, we cover a radius of about 80 miles with a strong, clear signal.

We have all new Collins Radio equipment, including a Collins 820-D 1 AM Transmitter.

Thank you for your interest in WOBR, and feel free to stop by the studios for the "grand tour" if you are ever in our area.
