Dear Mr. Moss:

This is to confirm or QSL your reception and logging of WERA On Nov 11, 1962 at 3:19 am EST. WERA was in the process of conducting equipment tests for it's annual proof of performance when you recieved our signal.

WERA is a 500 watt, directional antennae station with studio's located in the Park Hotel Annex in Plainfield, and transmitter on Oak Tree Road in South Plainfield. WERA is a daytime-only station, broadcasting from 6:30 am until local sundown seven days a week.

We transmit a figure eight pattern in a north-south direction, using three towers. Our transmitter is an RCA type BTA-1R, 1000 watt unit operated at half power.

We thank you for your interest and comments. If you should happen to be in our vicinity at any time and would like to see our installation, you may drop in at the transmitter anytime during normal programming hours, We would enjoy talking with you.
