Thank you for your report of reception of WPUT during our recent test broadcast. We are pleased to verify your reception of WPUT, 1510 kilohertz, on Monday morning February 10, 1975 between 2:01am and 2:33am E.S.T.. During this time WPUT was using its regular daytime power of 895 watts. We are also happy to confirm your reception of WPUT between 2:33am and 2:41am E.S.T. on February 10, 1975. During this time. WPUT was using its special pre-sunrise power of 50 watts. This power has been authorized for a maximum of one hour's use prior to sunrise, as a result of the observance of Daylight Time during the months when standard time is normally observed. WPUT uses a single tower, 140 feetthigh, located right outside our studio and office building, about 3/4 mile north of the downtown area of the village of Brewster. We heard from a total of 72 DXers as a result of this special broadcast, the most distant being in Lincoln, Nebraska (Carl Dabelstein). A very successful test! Sorry for the delay in answering your report, but time has been scaree, and it takes quite a while to answer all these reports. Congradulations on bagging yet another New York State station!
