
Dear DX'er:

This letter will confirm your DX report of March 20, 1957. The information in your correspondence referring to our programing is correct.

Now for a little information about our station. WAKU studios are located on the second floor of the Lowenstein Building in the heart of Latrobe and our transmitter is approximately one and one-half miles from the center of town. We operate with a 1000 watt RCA-BTA-1M Transmitter into a unidirectional antenna which is 152 feet in height, shunt feed. We also use a Gates remote control and frequency monitor with a General Radio Amplitude Modulator.

WAKU is a daylight station and operates from Sunrise to Sunset. If you at any time pick us up between Sign On and Sign Off, we would be pleased to hear from you and such information would be kept for our files. Any future verification of reception will be gladly accepted.
