Dear Sir:

We are happy to verify your reception of Station KTUT, Tooele, Utah, during our transmitter check and DX program on the morning of February 10, 1958, from 2:00-2:30, MST.

This program was our second for the NRC, the first having been November 18th, 1957.

This month's DX program was much more successful than the previous one. As of the above date, 37 reports have been received at KTUT, all except one reporting successful reception of our special program. Many DXers reported the presence of an unmodulated carrier on 990 kcs during our test; this was definitely identified as KATT, Pittsburg, California. In addition, Bill Stone of Toronto reported hearing trans-oceanic QRN, likely 2GZ, Orange, NSW, Australia. Grant Batson, "The Ox-Bow Hill DXer", and Carroll Seth, of Buffalo, N.Y., reported KECC on 990. Is this another station, or has KATT changed their call letters? We're not sure.

Most DXers reported that KATT's QRN was annoying, but it generally didn't cut our signal readability too much. Our signal was much stronger in the east this time--due, I suppose, to lack of electrical storms in that area which plagued our last DX in November.

KTUT enjoyed hearing from all DXers who reported. Our continued good wishes to the NRC, and to all DXers everywhere!
