Received your letter reporting reception of WHWB and am pleased to send you this letter of verification.

All of the information concerning musical selections and announcements on WHWB from 4:32 A.M. to 5:00 A.M. Eastern Standard Time, was correct in every detail.

WHWB operates, as you know, on 1000 Kilocycles with a power of 1000 Watts. We are a non-directional daytime station, our transmitter is a Raytheon Model RA-1000 and located about three miles Northwest of the City of Rutland. Our tower is a 259 foot self-supporting Lehigh.

You may be interested in knowing that we have received seventeen (17) letters and cards stating that they received us during the same period of time that you did. We will probably receive a great many more.
