In response to your request for verification of reception of a broadcast by this station, we are happy to oblige. You heard our monthly frequency check, which consists of a tone interrupted at periods for station identification, which was broadcast on the morning of February 10, 1954, beginning at 2 a.m. (CST).

We check the station frequency every month on the Wednesday morning following the second Tuesday of the month. The check is conducted with Claude M. Gray, Consulting Engineer, of Montgomery, Alabama.

In case you would be interested in some information as to the station and the town of Auburn, here are a few facts. W A U D has been in operation for almost eight years, being licensed since 1946. Using a Gates 250 C-1 transmitter, Gates console, turntables, and audio equipment, it operates on a full time power of 250 watts, on the frequency of 1230 kc. The town of Auburn is located about seventy-five miles north of Montgomery, Alabama, and about thirty-five miles east of Columbus, Georgia. Auburn is the home of the Alabama Polytechnic Institute, better known by the name Auburn.
