This letter is to verify your reception of KLAK on January 27, 1955 from 5:56-6:00 PM, on our regular schedule of broadcasts. We want to apologize for our delay in answering your report but the work in getting our station operating efficiently has kept us from answering reports sooner. KLAK started its regular broadcast schedule on 1-8-55 and we feature hillbilly music exclusively throughout our broadcast schedule. KLAK is located in "This Old House" at 1315 Oak Street in Lakewood, Colo. and if you are ever out our way be sure and stop in and visit us. We are now in the process of making up QSL cards and will send one along to you when we get them made up.

If you are interested in logging KLAK again we hold our regular monthly frequency check from 12:30-12:45 AM the 1st Saturday of each month. You might be interested in knowing that we have received reports in the U.S. as well as 10 reports from New Zealand so you can see we really get out for 250 watts. At present for the month of October we are signing off at 5:15 PM, MST so try for us then. We received another report from Nebraska from John Sampson of Omaha.

Our equipment is Gates throughout and our tower is 180 feet tall. Lekewood is a suburb of Denver with a population of 33,000 and it is only a short drive from here to the "beautiful mountains" of Colorado.

Thanks a million for the fine report and good DXing to you. Let us again extend an invitation for you to visit our studios the next time you visit your brother in Denver.
