I am writing this letter to confirm your reception of KSPN-AM on the morning of 28 April '88.


KSPN-AM is 5kW AM station (DAY) and 217 watts (NITE) and uses a Harris MW-5B AM transmitter with a 300 foot tower.

Originally KSPN-AM was KRVV-AM and broadcast on 1360 kHz. The lousy ground conductivity in Vail prompted the move to 610 kHz to gain increased signal strength in our primary coverage areas. I was surprised that you were able to receive us from such a distance away. Sometimes it seems hard enough to make it work well for our primary areas!

KSPN-AM simulcasts most of its' programming from our FM station in Aspen, CO except for local news at 7,8,9 & 12 Noon.

KZSS (Albuquerque) has a "dominant" signal in our outlying areas when we are on low power or off the air.
