Bill:

I am pleased to confirm your reception reports regarding KSTC and KSTC-FM on August 23 and 26.

The information you provided conforms to our station logs, indicating that you did, in fact, monitor our stations.

For your information, KSTC operates on 1230 KHz with a power output of 1000 watts. We have just recently installed a new, solid-state Harris MW-1-A AM transmitter, and we are most interested in reception reports.

KSTC-FM operates on 96.7 MHz with a power output of 940 watts ERP, horizontal and vertical, with an antenna 300 feet above average terrain. The antenna is a CCA FMC-LP-4 circularly polarized unit. The transmitter is an ITA FM-1000B. KSTC-FM does not transmit in stereo at this time, but stereo operation is expected by the first of the year.

KSTC and KSTC-FM are new call letters assigned by the FCC on July 1, 1977. The stations were previously identified as KGEK and KYOT-FM. We purchased the stations and assumed operations in mid June.

Our organization also owns and operates two other stations that should be well withing your reception area. KOGA is located in Ogallala, Nebraska and KNAP is located in Burlington, Colorado.

Again, I thank you for your reception reports, especially regarding KSTC. It might interest you to know we have been received as far east as St. Francis. Kansas.
