Dear Sir,

We were very pleased to receive your report concerning our emergency broadcasting of the canal break. On the morning of July 26, 1956 KUBC was on the air at the times you mentioned, and your logging of the program continuity is correct.

KUBC is at this time a 1600 watt day, 500 watt directional night station. We are at this time starting construction of our new 5 kilowatt rig. I think you will perhaps then be able to receive us on a somewhat regular basis since we will not only be much stronger power-wise, but we were lucky enough to latch on to 580 for the new frequency.

Montrose is a town located about 60 miles south of Grand Junction, Colorado, and at the present time has a population of about 6000. The altitude here is also 6000.

By the way, all the equipment here will be Gates when the new installation is in. We are at the present time operating on the 1000 watt W.E. transmitter. With (2) two 200 ft. towers.
