

Dear Sir:

We thank you for your letter reporting the reception of W-I-N-D on June 12, 1955. Such reports are very useful in checking our coverage and operating efficiency.

The program details you gave have been compared and found to agree with our program log.

W-I-N-D uses a four-tower directional antenna system, transmitting its maximum signal to the northwest from its transmitter near Gary, Indiana.

W-I-N-D installed its first directional antenna in 1934. It was the only such system in the middle-west at that time.

W-I-N-D was the first station in Chicago to operate 24-hours a day, and has been on this schedule continuously since 1941.

W-I-N-D is the only station in Chicago with duplicate main transmitters. Both are modern and complete in all respects, transmitting with 5,000 watts, the maximum power permitted on regional channels.

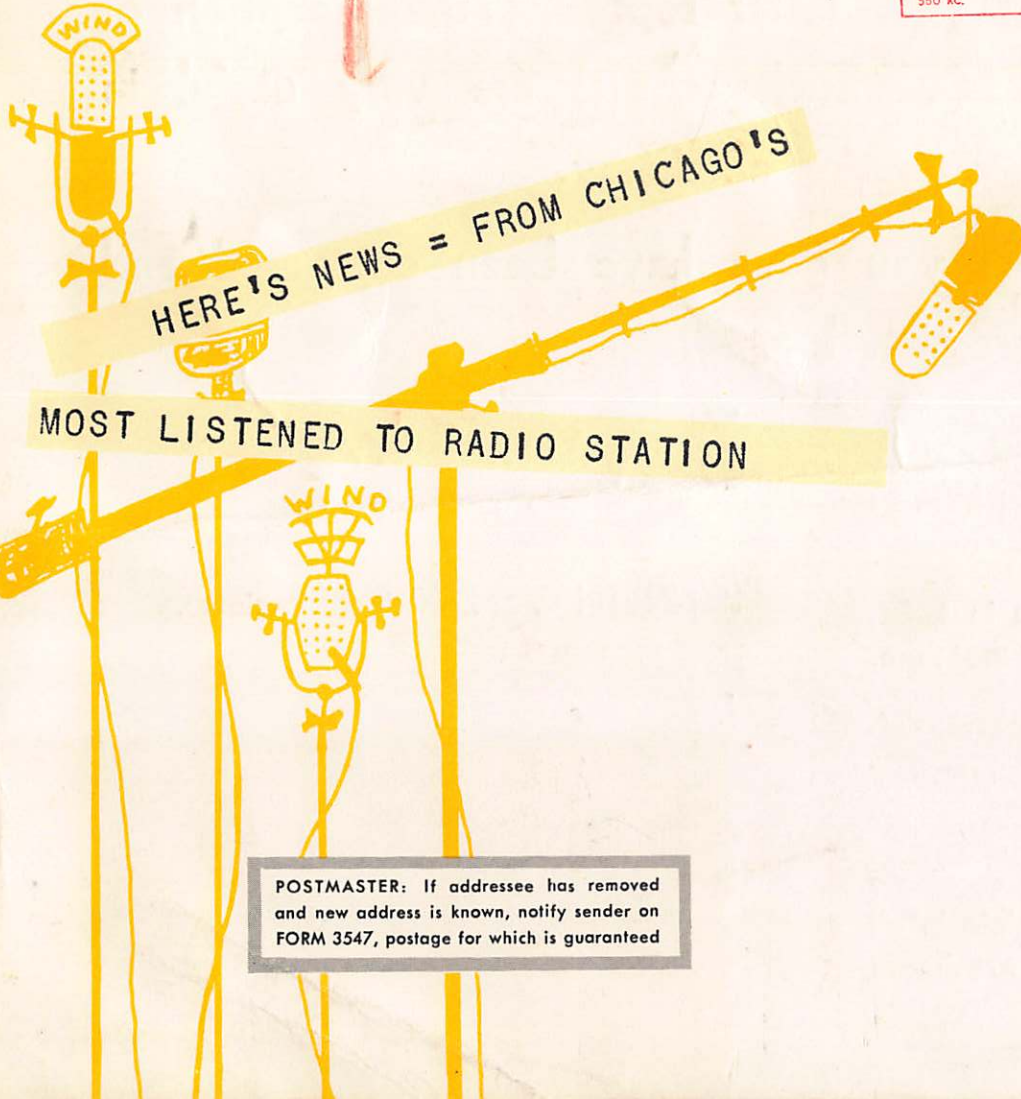
