Dear Mr. Nittler:

Many thanks foryour report on receiving KLIC. This will verify your report of KLIC, January, 5, at 1:15 AM, CST. I was out at KLIC at that time, making adjustments, replacing tubes, etc. We are using a Collins 250 watt transmitter. The antenna system consists of a tower 190' high, and the ground system consists of more than 240 radials of copper wire, each 200' in length, with the outer ends bonded to a circumference of heavy copper wire. We have received reports from all other the country,, 3 from New Zealand. The guys in New Zealand are using antennas from 500 to 600 feet in length. As you might know, they are not allowed to buy antthing from the USA, since it seems that money must be kept in New Zealand. That information was given me by one of the listeners there. KLIC operates weekdays, from 5:25 AM until 1:05 AM CST, Sundays from 6:00 AM to 12:00 Midnight CST. Our regular frequency check is every 3rd Tuesday of the month, from 2:00 to 2:15 AM.
