Confirming that KSLO was on the air with a frequency check on the morning of February 6, 1957 at 1:AM CST.

We are located in the heart of what could be called "Cajun Country" here in Southwest Louisiana. By "Cajun Country" we are referring to descendants of the French People who came here from Nova Scotia years ago and settled. Opelousas gets it's name from the Opelousas Indians and is generally translated "Black Leg."

A large portion of the people here continue to speak a french dialect and some can speak no english other than a friendly greeting or the like. It's a highly interesting section of the country historywise and I'm sure you would enjoy seeing it firsthand should the chance ever present itself.
