Many many thanks for your nice letter saying you heard our "test broadcast" Monday morning December 17, 1956.

As information, so far we have received 30 answers to our specail broadcast, this special broadc ast was put on to test our equipment only, tjis station operates daytime only since 1947 and we use RCA equipment.

The states we received answers from were Illinois, Ohio, Texas, Florida, New Jersey, Colorado, Nebraska, Missouri, North Carolina, West Virginia, Iowa, Deleware, Olkahoma, Georgia, Wisconsin, our home state Mississippi and one from Dunedin, New Zealand.

Picayune, Miss. located 60 miles northeast of New Orleans, is the only city in the world with that name. Picayune as you know means small, although we are only 8,000 population the city was named after a coin, of long ago, worth $2\frac{1}{2}\phi$.

We appreciate your letter very much, it is people like you that takes time to write to us, that makes radio even more interesting and worthwhile.
