In response to your inquiry as to difficulty of reception, we are also experiencing the same loss of signal due to the fact that the radials on our transmitter are half length. As you probably know, the radial length should equal the antenna height. Unfortunately, we had no control in this situation. However, we are in pursuit of time and materials to alleviate this situation. Eventually we hope to go to a 5,000 watt pulse.

We at KBSO/KBSR would like to also ask you a favor. Recently our sister station, KBSR-95.5 FM, was brought on line. KBSR runs a country format, and is carried on a 100,000 watt signal broadcasting from Hardin, MT. All of us at KBSO/KBSR would like to know how you receive 95.5 FM KBSR.
