Thank you very much for taking the time to report reception of RADIO BARBADOS. It is with great pleasure that I am able to verify that your report of reception on October 25,1965 is absolutely correct.

I would like to tell you a bit about our station. It is a commercial station, owned by the Government of Barbados and governed by a statutory Board. The Board runs the station with a completely free hand and it will not cost the Government one penny. All capital funds expended are borrowed from a commercial bank and are being repaid by advertising revenue. We began broadcasting on December 15, 1963.

We have a Marconi 10KW transmitter with two 300 foot guyed masts creating a northwestern pattern. It is designed to cover the Leeward and Windward Island chains. We broadcast on 795 kc/s. There are two studios completely equipped with RCA gear. We have an outside broadcast van that is completely self-contained. It has its own power generator and a 10-watt FM transmitter for broadcasting back to the station.

We are located on the west coast of Barbados, about 100 yards from the beach, 4 miles north of Bridgetown. On many maps there is a place called Lazaretto. We are on the Lazaretto property. The setting is absolutely beautiful and I hope that one day you will be able to visit Barbados.

Again, many thanks for writing to us and I hope that the RADIO BARBADOS verification report will be a valuable addition to your collection.
