Dear Mr. Nittler:

We are pleased to verify your report of reception during our frequency test on June 1, 1957.

KFJM is North Dakota's oldest broadcast station. Our station began in October, 1923, and has been the radio outlet of the University of North Dakota ever since.

The transmitter is a Gates BC-1F operating one kilowatt, non-commercial, daytime only, on 1370 kc. Our antenna system includes a 170 foot vertical wooden tower with a copper radiator running up the center. The operating facilities include a Gates SA-40 console as well as four Magnecord tape recorders, one large studio, and an announce booth.

We thank you for your letters and hope this will fulfill your requirements of verification.
