Dear Maurice,

Congratulations on the fine logging of radio station K000-1420. This letter will serve as a verification of your reception on March 21, 1957, the first day of spring and the first day of broadcasting of K000.

I had to keep the starting date of the station out of the DX news due to the delay of the FCC and their go ahead. But now that we are on, I'm bustin' over with joy. K000 operates in 1420 kilocycles with a power of 500 watts with 2 guyed 195' antennas about one-eighth of a mile south of the South Omaha Bridge road. And studios are at 2321 M street in South Omaha.

What I'm about to tell you next is to be kept "under your hat" for a few weeks, but K000 is planning to go 1000 watts with a little bit tighter pattern. I think that with this new pattern we will come down your way a bit more. I guess with the addition of this (K000) you'll only need 2 more Nebraskans. I need about 6 or 7 more.
