Bill,

Sorry you did not receive an acknowledgment of your previous report. I just started here in June, and have replied to every QSL report that has come to my attention. I'm a Broadcast band Dxr myself, and an active Ham so am aware of the importance of these little pieces of paper!

Your report appears to be consistent with the program being broadcast at that time. KBAD is operating at only 540 Watts at night into a 3 tower array with a minor lobe in your direction. Interestingly enough I was once the corporate engineer for one of the interfering stations, i.e. KLMR, Lamar Colorado. I've been in Mancos, at least 20 years ago when I was based out of Colorado Springs and traveling around the southwest on business.

I'm an active ham, SWL and sometimes BCB Dxr, although my primary interest is in Utilities on the HF band, mainly Search and rescue type stuff. I am often tuned to 5696 kHz for the Coast guard stuff! On the Ham bands I operate 160 Meters through 450 MHz as WB0KSW and operate Civil Air Patrol HF and VHF as Red Rock 117 (AZ wing, but transferring to NV wing.).
