Dear Mr. Nittler,

This letter will confirm your reception of our station between the hours of 12:45 and 1:00 A.M. PST on November 9, 1964.

We are always gratified to receive a reception report from IRCA members. It was particularly pleasing to get your report from the Englewood - Denver area. Strangely enough, most of our reception reports have been coming from the Northwest. We're quite happy to hear that our signal can compete successfully in the mountain area with XEG in Monterrey.

You may also be interested in our equipment. We are a 500 Watt, Non-Directional Daytime Station, using a Collins Transmitter for our AM operation. We also operate a 24 hour per day FM operation with a radiated power of 5000 watts.

Since you reported reception of our frequency test, you may also be interested in knowing that we were only slightly below our assigned frequency of 1050 KC. We were at the time of your report operating on exactly 1049.9988 KC, just 1.2 Cycles Per Second below our assigned operating frequency. As you undoubtedly know, that is well within the FCC requirements of plus or minus 20 cycles per second frequency deviation.

Your most welcome reception report is most gratifying for still another reason. It gives us a good idea of how our new antenna ground radial system is working.

Again, Mr. Nittler, thanks so much for your reception report. If you should hear us again, please drop us a line.
