Dear Sir:

This is to certify that you heard our station on the date of October 5th, 1954 between 5:15 and 5:30 ~~PM~~.

Enclosed is ~~two~~ pictured of the two that you heard on this station at this time...Nick was the one you heard announcing and I, with the glasses on was the one who read the news at 5:30.

The frequency of this station is 1570 Kilocycles and a power of 250 watts, using a Gates Transmitter with an antenna tower of 208 feet in height, and the tower is feed about 1/3 of the way to the top and the base is grounded with 120 radials 130 feet in length in the ground. The tower is 1/8 mile west of the transmitter and is fed with a series of cables to the tuning house at the base of the tower.

I hear KOLS up in Iowa in the early monring when I visit my folks in Iowa. I am glad to receive you letter and want to thank you for it. We are planning on goinging to 500 watts in the next month or two and will use the same transmitter except put an 833-D in the final stage.

The announcer you heard was Warren Nichodemus and he is on in the afternoon with me and all day Sunday....

I wish you w uld have told us what kind of receiver you received this station on....We have two 100 watt portable transmitters on 26.29 Meg. Cycles and use a Hallifrafters for our two way pickup and remote broadcasting to the main studios with KOLS. KOLS was 3 years old in July 3rd.

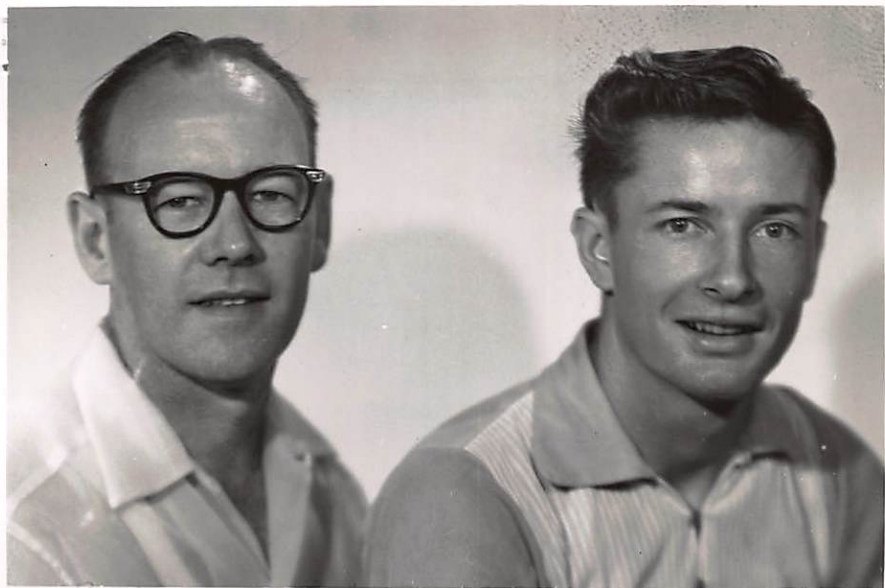
