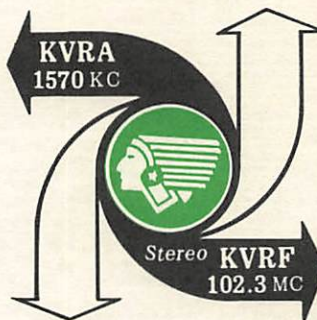

Dear Bill;

First, a thousand apologies for the long delay in verifying your DX of our station. We have undergone some management and personnel changes and it is just now that the DX letters are being channelled to my desk. The bulk of my day has been taken up with apologizing to DXers all around the country. Being a TV DXer, I realize the value you put on a DX verification.

I am truly amazed that our signal carried as far west as it did. The bulk of our receptions come from out east. This is because our daytime authority runs fifteen minutes later in the day than 1570 stations in Iowa or other eastern states. Consequently, these stations shut down and clear a path for us to pour our signal unrestricted all the way to Indiana. We do have a rather remarkable situation here. With ground conductivity measured at 34 and a 300 foot 5/8 wave-length antenna, we cover quite a bit of territory with only 500 watts.

Thank you for your letter. Enclosed is a coverage map.
