We wish to acknowledge the receipt of your letter stating reception of Radio Station KCNY. We know it definitly was KCNY because our log for that day looked exactly the same as your outline. Our broadcast day starts at four o'clock C. S. T., Monday through Friday, and you received one of our regular programs.

We wish to thank you for your detailed report and are really surprised that you received our 250 watt station as clearly as you indicated.

We have a 250 watt Collins transmitter and a 150 foot antenna, non-directional. We have a fairly clear signal and reach out approximately one hundred miles during daytime operation.

If there are any other members in the DX League who are able to receive us that would like a letter for their collection, have them write us acknowledging reception of our station and we will in turn acknowledge their letter.

From four until six (C.S.T.) in the morning, we program Hillbilly music; from six until twelve (C.S.T.) noon, we program in Spanish; from twelve until local sunset in the afternoon, we program in English and play popular music.
