The following letter of verification on your reception report hopefully will give you what you need. We are pleased to hear from you in connection with your reception report letter received on April 15<sup>th</sup>, 2005. All the information you have provided us appears to be correct with what was broadcast at the times you give. You are the first dx reporter indicating that you heard HERO Radio on 1650 Khz since the change of format from Classic Hit Country to Alternative Rock on April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2005.

We do not have any kind of card to send you but will do so when it is available. I would think that you would get away from that 1650 station KBJD in Denver since you moved from Mancos, Colorado to the Albuquerque area. Yes, we have passed Belen many times driving up to a music camp located in the Jemez mountains near Jemez Springs, NM.

KBJD-AM in Denver operates at a power of 10,000 watts and KHRO-AM operates at 8,500 watts. The lower power is because the FCC thinks we should protect the Mexican stations on the expanded band. One problem with that is that there are no Mexican stations on the expanded band that I know of. One is supposed to be on 1620 in Juarez, Mexico that is our neighboring city across the river but they are not on the air.
