Dear Mr. Nittler:

This is to confirm the reception of KSGB-AM 1540 kHz on January 14, 1990.

Thank you very much on behalf of our staff and myself for your excellent reception report.

KSGB is currently operating under the Special Temporary Authority Rules of the Federal Communications Commission Rules and Regulations. KSGB operates from 6:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight Central Standard Time on an assigned frequency of 1540 kilohertz with a power of 10,000 watts day and 250 watts night, both non-directional.

We are in the process of building a new transmitter plant, upon completion KSGB will operate with a power of 12,500 watts day power and 5,000 watts night.

While digging in my file cabinet last week, I found a copy of a reception report confirmation dated March 26, 1976. It was addressed to Bill Nittler 603 West 1st McCook Nebraska 69001. The call of the radio station was KRXV. I presume this might be yourself. I also found another confirmation addressed to a Mr. Maurice W. Nittler 2818 So. Cherokee Englewood, Colorado. The call of the station at time was KCUL and the letter was dated November 7, 1957. Any relation?

Out of a dozen or so copies of reception report confirmations, two were to gentlemen with the surname Nittler, it is a very small World.
