
Sir:

Sorry for the delay in acknowledgement of your letter, but am rather slow about writing.

I had been broadcasting since one A. M. as I usually do the second Tues. of each month for frequency test. The tone was naturally heavier than my voice because modulation of a continuance tone as that will drive the modulators stronger than anything else and also my mike gain was somewhat lower than the tone.

I have been here since January and I usually get notice of reception of our signal from someplace; usually east and north of Texas. In Ohio and Indiana. In that general direction. And am a little surprised that you heard us in Geneva.

Kermit is in what a lot of people would call a desert area. There is no farming here at all and very little cattle raising. However, the economic condition in this area is very good due to the oil production. You have probably heard something of the Permian Basin oil field. Kermit lies on the northwestern edge of this; about forty miles slightly north and west of Odessa, Texas.

I hope that you continue to have good reception in your D X work.

Thanks for the letter. So far, yours is the only one received of our last frequency check. Some times when we get them we don't reply right away but yours was addressed to me so I will answer.

The KOCA means, Kilgore, Oil Capitol of America. we are just a 250 watt station and the day range is about fifty miles and the night range is very good. we use to stay on the air till 3 in the morning on public information and such, you know, trying to sell things. I played a variety of music and then read spots. we got letters from as far away as Washington State.

Talking about the weather, we haven't had any snow here all winter but we did have a little sleet and some pretty bad freezes. As a matter of fact it froze Monday night. Not bad tho.

Kilgore has a population of about ten thousand and has the record of having the most oil well in the city limits of any town in the U.S. There are 3331 wells in the city limits and in one block or in half a block there is 30 wells. We also have Kilgore College and one of the fastest growing little communities in Texas. This is not a Texas brag like you have heard about the truth.

By the way, my name is Bill Moore and my home is Paris, Texas. I'm a DJ on the station here and work the night shift. I'm 21 and attend the College here in Kilgore.


In reply to your letter requesting verification of the program you heard on 25 July 1954, the program material you listed is correct.


