P.S. We are running 5 Thousand watts days on a Collins 21A transmitter and 1 thousand watts nights on a home made transmitter. Our ^{ANTENNA} system consists of One $\frac{1}{4}$ wave ground plane vertical in the daytime and Four of the same type at night. They are 195 feet tall. We operate on 1290 Kilocycles.
