Dear Bill:

This letter will confirm your reception of KJQN, Ogden, Utah on December 3, 1979. I regret that we do not have any QSL cards to send you, but with a nighttime power of 250 watts, it didn't seem necessary. Recently we have been receiving quite a few DX reports, though, from as far away as Vancouver, B.C.

KJQN operates 24 hours as a non directional station with 1000 watts daytime, and 250 watts nighttime, as do most of our fellow Class IV AM stations. We use a 1/4 wave antenna, and are hoping to construct a 5/8 wave antenna as soon as the FCC decides what nighttime power Class IV stations will be allowed to use in the future.

Our format is Adult Top 40, and right now we are very much number one in Ogden, despite strong competition from stations in nearby Salt Lake City. If you're ever in town, be sure and look us up. Thanks again for your DX report.
