Dear Maurice,

Thanks very much for your letter notifying us of your reception of our station in Geneva, Nebraska.

We seemed to have quite a bit of QRM on us from KGIL; a Mexican station, and several stations testing on the frequency. Still, we are very pleased with the response that we received from the National Radio Club and it's many members.

We are a 1000 watt daytime station, operating on 1260 kcs. We are using RCA equipment all the way thru from the console to the transmitter, except for Presto tape recorders. Our antenna is 214 feet tall(overall height), uniform cross section, guyed, and series excited. We are equipped with a Vandivere Sequencer and AMI record changer for automatic operation, but have had so much trouble with it that we rarely use it.

This letter will serve as verification of your reception of our station during equipment and program tests on the morning of November 12, 1956 during the hours of 12:00 AM PST to 2:00 AM PST.

We are planning another such test in the not too distant future, and hope for better results next time.
