
Dear Mr. Nittler:

1 Thank you for your letter of Oct 12, 1970, telling of 9
4 reception of WIGM on that date during a special DX program 9
9 for the NRC and IRCA. Your log of the program checks reasonably
of your report. .

0 At the time of the special DX program, WIGM was on the air 3
with 1000 watts of power. Our transmitter is Collins, and the
other equipment is a mixture of RCA and Western Electric, and
our antenna is 311 feet high. Our studios and transmitters are MC
located in the same building at the edge of the city of Medford
on highway 13. We have the ABC network and UPI news service. We
also simulcast on WIGM-FM with 3 Kw of power circular polarized.
WIGM has been on the air since Oct 26, 1941, and WIGM-FM has been
operating since Dec 14, 1968.

The city of Medford with population of 3500, calls itself
the "Mink Capital of the World", having the greatest number of
private mink ranchers served out of a single post office in the
United States - within a radius of 20 miles of Medford.

Good luck to the NRC and IRCA from the management of WIGM.
