Dear Mr Nittler,

Thankyou for your letter reporting reception of our Medium Wave transmitter on 844 KHz for the 2nd of March 70. at 2050 to 2130. We are pleased to verify your details are correct. You, we close our transmissions at about 21.30 signing off with the Nation Anthem.

We broadcast each evening in English, Ellice and Gilbertese. At the time you were listening the language would be Gilbertese. The call sign of our station was VTW but this was found to coincide with another station, in India somewhere I think, and our call sign was changed to VSZ.

We used to broadcast on SW as well but since we have had the new 10KW on 844 we find that the colony is better served by this and have closed down the SW transmissions. We have had reception reports for this new transmitter from as far away as Philadelphia and the south of New Zealand.
