We confirm that it was indeed a broadcast from the B.B.C. which you heard on 1214 kHz at 0553 - 0730 hours B.S.T. on the morning of 21st October, 1967. This wavelength carries the Radio 1 transmissions of the B.B.C. which is our popular music programme.
