I am very pleased to report reception of your FM station by me in McCook this date January 25, 1979 on 99.1 Mhz. The following is what I was able to log on your signal:
5:57 program about poison plants with Doug Wakefield of the USDA.
P.M. News items featuring actions of Riverside City Council followed, PST talking about boycott of program, "60 Minutes" and other action.
6:00 after brief weather forecast, gave temperature as 48 degrees downtown and said this had been the KBBL evening news.
Identified as KBBL and then presented, "More Abundant Health" with Michael Connor and Dr. Eppey Hartsuker.

Your signal was coming in with following clarity:
Loud and clear. 10 other California stations were identified tonight, also in this rare winter skip opening.

Would appreciate it very much if you would send me a card or letter of verification on my reception of your radio station. I have enclosed a self-addressed, stamped envelope for your convenience in replying. Thank you very much for this favor.

Although I have been broadcast band dxing for nearly 30 years, I just began listening to the FM band about 2 years ago. To date, I have logged 258 stations in 26 states and Mexico, with 207 of them verified by the stations.

McCook is located in the southwest corner of Nebraska. We have a population here of around 9000 people and are an agricultural center.

Will be looking forward to hearing from you soon. Good luck to you in your future broadcasting activities.
