Dear Bill:

Thank you for your reception report and thanks for the note. I have no idea what may have happened to your earlier letter. I usually am very meticulous with reception reports and keep all on file. I have had many reports over the years about our FM signal being picked up in seemingly far away places. It is usually in that 2000 km to 2800 km radius which the reports come from (Eskip). One of my last was downtown New York City!

CITI's original owner was Moffat Broadcasting Limited. Ownership changed hands in September, 1992, to Rogers Broadcasting Limited.

CITI began broadcasting on channel 221 (92.1 MHz) in 1962. Originally broadcasting from a transmitter site inside the City limits, CITI moved to its present site 33 km south of the City of Winnipeg in 1973. Two Continental 316R-4B transmitters are used to feed the Sira 10 bay, 30 panel directional antenna which is centred at 245m above ground.

The main lobe ERP is 360,000 watts. The minor lobe is 60,000 watts. Average ERP is 210,000 watts.

CITI does not have any standby transmitters. Each of the two transmitters provide backup to one another. If one fails, the station remains on the air with no interruption, but, at a reduced power level.
