very good for just a few moments at a time. Other midwest (KY/TN/IN/MO) stations coming in at the time on skip



My receiver is a Hammarlunds HQ-180 using a 125 long wire antenna and/or a directional loop antenna. I have been dxing since 1950 and have more than 2900 verification of receptions on the AM band, 300 on FM and have heard 75 countries on short wave.
