Dear Bill,

Thank you for your letter of 21 July. This summer seems to be a summer of high sunspot or lots of solar activity. As a result, there has been a lot of sporadic E type reflections on the higher frequency bands. You are of course a witness to this with your report of hearing our FM station-KPQX.

KPQX has the studios north of Havre while the transmitter is on Bowery Peak--26 Miles south of Havre. A microwave link ties the two together. We run 16,500 watts to the 12 bay antenna which is circularly polarized for an effective radiated power of 94,000 watts. The height above average terrain, as calculated by the FCC rules is 1786 feet, though in reality, the site is about 3000 feet above prairie. We cover about 200 miles in most directions as a result. KPQX is a sister station of KOJM-AM.

I appreciate your interest in the station and thank you for your report. Enclosed is a photocopy of our log for that evening. Those items you mentioned are shown.
