Dear Bill:

Thank you for your reception report of April 18, 1977. Your log of our programming for the period of 9:35 PM to 10:55 PM is correct except for one detail. The time you have listed for the I.D. and GNC ad should be 9:55 PM instead of 9:45 PM.

KRGI has an AM station at 1430 KHZ as well as the FM stereo at 96.5 MHZ. A majority of our FM programming is an automated system of tape decks controlled by a small computer with a print-out for our program logs. The program material is relayed from our studio's in downtown Grand Island to our transmitter 3 miles southwest of town via a microwave link. The transmitter is a Collins 831G with an output power of 17.5 kilowatts. The antenna is a Collins 12 bay unit mounted on a 500 foot tower. Our effective output power is 100 kilowatts.

In verifying your reception report I would like to thank you again as we always appreciate hearing from our listeners. A brief note that a good signal with occasional fading is an indication of a skip signal.
