Dear Bill,

This is to confirm your reception of KSRD on April 14, 1977. KSRD was on the air at the times you mentioned with programming as you described.

KSRD operates from 6:00 AM to 12:00 midnight CLT Monday through Saturday, and 7:00 AM to 10:30 PM on Sunday. Enclosed is our coverage map.

I also am into DXing of various natures. I'M currently into amateur radio (WAØOCW), AM DXing (member of NRC and IRCA), shortwave broadcast DXing (member NASWA), and TV DXing (best receptions - WGR, Buffalo, NY CH. 2; and a N.C. station on CH. 3 while KMTV Omaha CH. 3 was also on the air). Also have done some "informal" FM DXing, but have failed to keep a log of it. FM DXing, like TV DXing is most easily done during the summer months. Starting late May, or June, you should start hearing stations between you and the east coast. West coast FM/TV DX is difficult from Nebraska because of the Rocky Mountains. Your FM Dx totals should be in much better shape by next fall and the start of "AM DX season."
