The interest that I have in this hobby goes back to 1950 when I began dxing on the AM band where I have heard over 3100 AM radio stations in 61 countries and have verifications from over 2770 of them. On FM, I have heard 263 stations since I began listening to FM in 1976 with verifications received from 227 of them.
