Dear Bill,


It was nice to hear that we have an audience in Southwestern Colorado.

Its great to know you have listeners in distant places!


Your reception report is accurate and hereby verified.

A little about us, the KGLX transmitter is located on Gibson Peak, some six miles north of Gallup and approximately 140 miles from you! KGLX operates a Harris HT 25, twenty five kilowatt transmitter with approximately 11KW output into an 8 bay antenna on a two hundred foot tower. The output is 51 thousand watts effective radiated power. The tower height is approximately 1250 feet above average terrain, at about 8 thousand feet.

KFXR operates as a class C-2 facility with 3.6 kilowatts of power, generated by a CCA 8 kilowatt transmitter. The KFXR transmitter is at approximately 1500 feet above average terrain some 2500 feet above the Chinle-Monument Valley.
