My hobby is dxing (listening for radio stations) on the AM & FM bands. Reception reports are sent all stations that I hear with the hopes that I will receive a verification of my reception of the station.

Such a report was sent to your station but to date has gone unanswered. I realize that a radio station is a busy place and it is easy to overlook someone's hobby when it is not vital to your business. Nevertheless, I would like to ask that you send me a brief verification of reception message on your station letterhead or coverage map. (A STAMPED, SELF-ADDRESSED ENVELOPE IS ENCLOSED)

This is my record of the reception of your station:

Date September 29, 1977 Frequency 104.9 mc.

Program details heard:

- 11:30 P.M. CDT program called "Opinion Line" which was a call in program. Discussion of congressional pay raises.
- 11:36 weather forecast mentioning clear skies and 75 degrees at KJIL. IDed as "Radio with a purpose. Gospel in full dynamic stereo, FM105 for the finest in gospel".
Then announcer read item about teaching handicapped and discussed special education.

The interest that I have in this hobby goes back to 1950 when I began dxing on the AM band. I have heard over 3000 AM stations in 60 countries and have verifications of reception in my collection of more than 2725 stations. On FM, I have heard over 230 stations in the past two summers with 170 verifications received.


I thank you for your efforts and wish you continued success in your broadcasting activities.
