
Dear Mr. Nittler:

This is to confirm your reception report dated May 16, 1978. I have enclosed a photocopy of our computerized program log print-out. The sequence of the items you logged is correct, and I can confirm that the Tony Bennett, Brrok Benton, and Dionne Warwick selections did play in the order you listed them during that evening. The times printed out on the log I enclose are within one second of WWV.

Congratulations on logging such a distant station. We transmit with a McMartin BF-25K Transmitter, using 21KW out, and a ten-bay circularly polarized Phelps-Dodge antenna, to obtain an ERP of 100 KW. Our antennas are side-mounted on a 283 Foot guyed tower, with the uppermost guy-wires made of Phyllistrand to reduce signal interference from the guy-wires.

KCOT has been on the air since early June, 1977. Our most distant reception report came from the U.S.-Canadian border during our first month of operation. Thanks for your report, and good DX'ing.
