
Dear Mr. Nittler,

I am pleased to confirm your reception report of June 28th, 1994. The announcer on duty was probably Debra Fraser or Jim Bell from our news department. *Marketplace* is the last program in our 4:00 - 6:30 pm news strip, following NPR's *All Things Considered*.. I receive one or two reception reports a year during the summer months; the farthest to date is from Provincetown, MA.

KUHF operates on 88.7 MHz FM stereo with an ERP of 100,000 watts from an antenna 1,671 ft. (!) above average terrain in Missouri City, Texas (some 10 miles SSW of Houston proper - as are all tall-towers in the Houston area). KUHF is a non-commercial educational FM station licensed to the University of Houston (UH) and affiliated with National Public Radio (NPR); studios are located on the UH central campus in Houston, Texas. We broadcast classical music and NPR news 24-hours a day serving the Houston-Galveston SMSA. As the #1 public radio station in Texas and thirteenth nationwide in audience, KUHF-FM is well listened to. The distance to our FCC 50/50 contour (primary coverage) is 54 miles, and the distance to our FCC 50/10 contour (fringe coverage) is 104 (!) miles. We can be heard in Waco, Texas, about 150 miles away.

Writing a QSL for reception reports such as yours is one of the pleasures of being an Engineer for a major metropolitan radio station. I am enclosing a copy of the program guide page for the day you were listening, and other premiums as I can.
