I am very pleased to report reception of your radio station on 104.5Mhz. June 17, 1980. The following are program details that I logged from your signal:

1:36 P. M. CDT woman announcer talking about song which was played "It's Good To Love You Lady" by Guy Clark/Texas Cookin' "Good afternoon, Sister Sarah here" Ad for the Zoom Bus trip to Dallas for the Texas World Music Festival. Talked about a Thursday deadline of 4 P.M. with busses leaving from the Jefferson County Airport on Sat. morning at 2 AM. Signal then faded out.

Would appreciate it very much if you would send me a card or letter of verification on my reception of your station. I have enclosed a self-addressed, stamped envelope for your convenience in replying. Thank you very much for this favor.

Your signal was coming in with the following clarity:
Very good for just the few minutes I had you. Other Beaumont/Port Arthur/Livingston/Crockett stations were also in at the time.

Nucla/Naturita are two towns located approximately 350 miles S.W. of Denver in Uranium mining country. We have a population of around 2000 people here.
