Dear John,


I am very sorry that my reply to you is so delayed but I only work at the station on Sundays and have to commute between Hemet and Los Angeles, where I am studying at UCLA. Unfortunately, I wasn't able to answer you last weekend because we experienced several local disasters and I was busy writing up the news stories about them. However, I hope I can make it all up to you by confirming the report that you sent us.

I was extremely pleased to receive your report of receiving our KHSJ-AM programming on Sunday, February 25, 1968. It really surprised me when I walked into the station two weeks ago and read your letter. It's nice to know that our signal can cover such a great distance at times. Every item you listed of our programming for the 25th is exactly what went over the air. (What surprised me the most was how well you understood my last name on the newscast. It's Kazaroff; you reported "Casbrook," but that's all right cause most people here in the valley won't even try to pronounce it!)

We have several stations here in Southern California which are on 1320 too. There's one in Oceanside, Palm Springs, and Los Angeles. I believe the reason you were able to receive us on the 25th was because the other stations had not signed on the air at that time.

We would sure appreciate hearing from you again, John. Perhaps one day you might be able to receive our fm station, KHSJ-FM. Both the AM and the FM are simulcast, incidently. Until then, I'd like to thank you for your report from everyone on the staff and management of KHSJ.
