Dear Mr. Sampson:

Many thanks for your letter requesting verification of our signal on the night of Sunday, October 9th.

You certainly did hear us - the Symphony was Beethoven's 7th, and while our sign-off is usually 10 p.m. our time - the Symphony ran a little over and this confirms our sign-off at about 10:05 p.m.

Yours is one of the furthest signals we have received; only Sunnyvale and Modesto are further. Before we raised our power to a thousand watts and moved from 1350 to 950 we were received further than we have yet to be received on this frequency. We've in the past had about ten reports from various parts of New Zealand.

I was making the announcements you heard. Oakland is my former home and its always nice to hear from folks down that way. Thanks again for your report.
