We received your letter and were quite pleased to learn that our signal reached you if even for only a few moments.


Our authorized power is 1000Watts daytime which we reduce to 250 Watts at local sunset. So when you picked us up we were operating on lo power. The weather at that time was foggy and cold here at thzat time. The temperature was aproximately 28 degrees.

A check with our logs verifies your list of our proگرامing between 10:30 and 10:40 PM PST on February 5, 1968. We carried Mutual News at 10:30 followed by a station ID and a public service spot for the Welcome Wagon. We have been unable to pin down the musical selection that followed but since our format is Country and Western it could have been any number of songs which roughly match the description of the tune you mentioned, "Never On Sunday."

Incidently our transmitter is an ITA 1000/250, transmitting into a grounded 160 foot non-directional tower.
