

It is with a great deal of pleasure that I acknowledge your reception report of our station. We do have call letters and they are simply ACE standing for Army Communications. Soon we will be known as AFCN, the Armed Forces Caribbean Network. We serve, presently, the Navy and the Army up and down the island. Effective 1 Jan '65 we will incorporate the Air Force' Ramey Air Force Base into the network. We only push 50 watts but, you'd be surprised at the results when you have relay points located at strategic points around the island. The day after I received your reception report I also received one from Milwaukee, Wisconsin. The program you heard the morning of the 30th was transcribed and it is called "Country Corner". Then the Lyle you thought you heard was actually Miles Kusic our early A.M. DJ. By the way, I happen to be a native New Jersey type. I have lived all of my life in Iselin, Nj and as a matter of fact my parents, sisters and relatives all live within ten miles either side of Iselin. At any rate, I say again, it was a pleasure receiving your report and you can rest assured that it was ACE radio in San Juan, Puerto Rico that you heard. By the way, our satellite stations are located at the big navy base Roosevelt Roads and the navy communication center at Fort Allen. We are ~~not~~ but they call the Key Station. I'll take this opportunity to issue you an invitation to drop by and visit with us should you ever be in Puerto Rico. We are located in Historic El Morro Castle, San Juan. Thanks again for your report.
